Here are some changes to our CSMLA members postal match. The format is changed in a way that will make the match more accessible to all our members. Here are the entire rules for the postal match including changes which are in **bold.**

What is the entry fee? There is no entry fee. There is no cost to participate. Who can enter? The CSMLA postal is for CSMLA members only. Memberships include all family members

including children under age 18 and junior members.

How do I get targets? You can download targets at

What if I don't have access to the internet how can I get targets? **In a pinch, you can contact Ron Mann at 303-257-7239. He will send you a single target which you can copy or have copied.** Targets do not have to be mailed in. **Text or email a photo of your target (get close!) to Ron Mann at 303-257-7239**

Targets and photos of targets must be whole. No missing corners or torn off portions.

The match is scored monthly and winners determined annually. **At the end of the year the shooter with the highest single target score for the year will win 2 pounds of powder. The shooter with the second highest single target score for the year will win 1 pound of powder.** Winners will be announced and prizes awarded at the annual Convention and Trade Show in March. Targets and scoring:

- Participants will be registered as individual shooters and as team members for their respective club if desired (Shooting as a team is not required to participate)
- There will be two targets each at 25yds, 50yds and 100yds with five shots each made for score on each target. Participants will complete their targets during three relays.
- Shooting order will be assigned at registration.
- Scoring for individual participants will be aggregate for the overall match and for each distance with the top three individuals placing at each distance and for overall match score.
 - Individual awards will be cash awards for place – 1st Place - \$3, 2nd Place \$2, 3rd Place \$1.
- There is no team size requirement. Teams will be scored by the averaged aggregate score for all members representing their respective club.
 - Top team takes the “bragging” trophy to hold until next year.

Directions:

From Eaton: Head East from US Hwy 85 on County Road 74 towards Galeton. Turn North on County Road 51. Range is on the West/ left side of the road.

From Ault: Head East from US Hwy 85 on US Hwy 14. Stay right at the curve that turns into County Road 82. Turn South on County Road 51. Range is on the West/ right side of the Road.

At the Range: Enter code at the gate to enter range property. Follow the range road south, past the clubhouse and shotgun fields, and then west to the South berms. Look for a large pavilion between berms S3 and S4 and park nearby. Registration will be in the small building north of the pavilion.

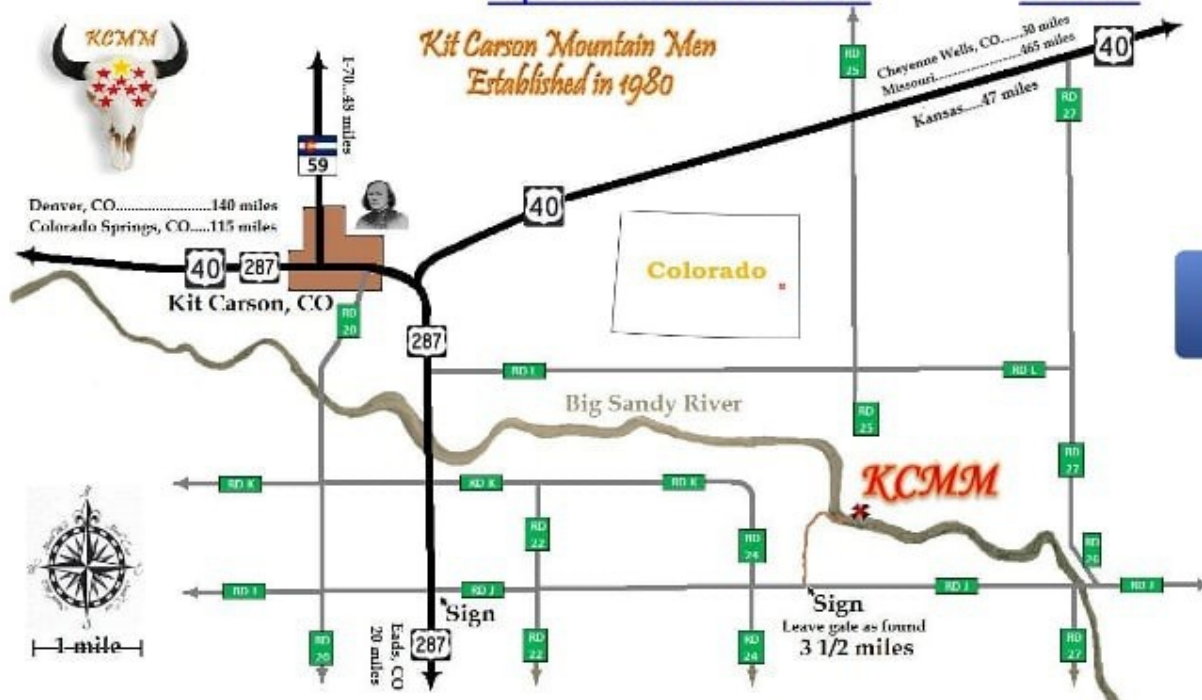

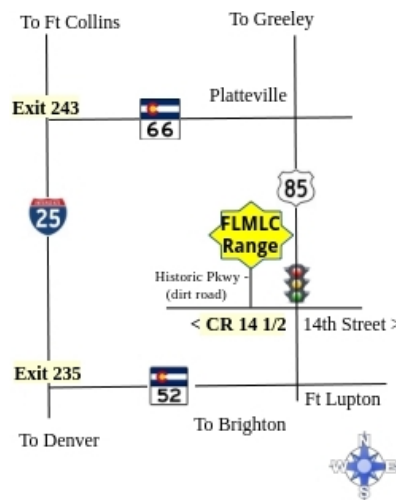
