#### Wildlife Report from CSMLA Wildlife Director David McCord

By approval of CSMLA members at the March 12 meeting, we joined the Colorado Wildlife Conservation Project (CWCP) together with over 20 other charter members. The CWCP came into being largely to oppose the "cat" bill, SB22-031, introduced this year in the Colorado Senate and defeated. The bill would have made it illegal to kill, wound or trap lynx, bob cats and mountain lions. The proponent appears to be from the Humane Society of the United States who they attempted a similar move before the Colorado Wildlife Commission last year and were denied. They then gained support from a willing Boulder senator to sponsor this attempt. The bill went to hearing before the Senate Ag committee and was soundly postponed indefinitely, dead. All but one of the bill's sponsors removed their names from the bill, they no longer wanted to be associated with something going down. We opponents had an impact. The organizers went on to formal creation of the CWCP.

CWCP members include Colorado Bowhunters Association, RMEF, Safari Club, Back Country Hunters and Anglers, Teddy Roosevelt Conservation Partnership, Coloradans for Responsible Wildlife Management (mostly trappers), Wild Turkey Foundation, Mule Deer, Congressional Sportsmen's Foundation, National Wildlife Foundation, Big Horn Society and about a dozen others. Not just an opposition group, the CWCP has offered support to HB22-1168 to provide an opportunity for hunter education for all 7<sup>th</sup> grade school children, expressed concerns about the pollinator bill (bill

was "PI'ed"), supported the Habitat Stamp bill renewal, supported SB22-151, Safe Crossings For Colorado Wildlife And Motorists, and supported the bill funding the Colorado Department of Natural Resources. In early March CWCP members spoke before the CPW Commission to explain the purpose and mission and were favorably received.

CSMLA is not obligated to support positions taken by the CWCP, we can offer support, remain silent, express concern, or oppose a CWCP position and we can submit issues for CWCP consideration and action. We can withdraw our membership at any time. The organization structure includes a chair, vicechair, board, committees and the larger membership. CSMLA is obligated to join one or more of the committees and to attend a minimum number of meetings, most being via Zoom. Committees are Steering, Communications and Media, Government Relations and Lobbying, Outreach and Public Engagement, Policy, and Colorado Parks and Wildlife Commission. I am prepared to attend meetings and signed on to the Outreach and Public Engagement Committee. CSMLA members are welcome to also be included. Let me know. As information and actions surface, I will share on the CSMLA website and via email, with our Board (especially where immediate action is important). A CWCP web site will soon be launched.

Our first official CWCP request was to add our name to a letter of support for SB22-151 Safe Crossings For Colorado Wildlife And Motorists sent to the Transportation and Energy Committee for a hearing on March 24. "Concerning the creation of a cash fund for use by the department of transportation to fund projects that provide safe road crossings for connectivity of wildlife and thereby reduce wildlife-vehicle collisions."

For a cute video on the success of existing crossings and highway game fencing find "The Colorado Highway 9 Wildlife Crossing Project" for the highway south of Kremling. The hunter education bill for 7<sup>th</sup> graders, HB22-1168, was approved by the Senate Ag and Natural Resources Committee March 17 and referred to the "Senate Committee of the Whole" (editors note: the bill has passed both chambers and may have been signed by the Governor at time of this issue creation). The bill received universal support at its consideration by the House. CWCP members provided testimony in support at Thursday's hearing including two Boy Scouts in uniform together with their father.

As items arrive from the CWCP I will make a recommendation and relay them for Griz's directions on how to handle and if it seems like an issue needs discussion, he will send it to the BOD.
